Comments on Regulation, if any:

The license is renewed every year for one year.

The Israeli Private Investigations Law was introduced in 1972, and is today very outdated. We are striving to update and correct it.

The Law in Israel does not define "private investigation" it defines the "private investigator" as the person licensed to gather information for a fee.

Today after several changes in other laws coinciding with this one it excludes different information or data gathered by other resources.

In order to obtain such a license a PI has to have a previous **experience of 3 years**, which can be obtained by supervised internship or previous work in one of the four government investigating authorities.

Once licensed a PI can only work for a PI agency with a proprietor's license and is not allowed to accept work directly from clients.

**After five proven years of work as a PI** one can apply for a **PI Proprietor's license**, which renders the ability to accept work from clients and supervise the work of PI's and or train interns.

This is a definition which the **IBPI** strives to correct by having "private Investigation" defined clearly and requiring the license holder to act accordingly.
